Improving our School

Each year, we work as a school to gather and analyse data so that we can continually improve the educational experience offered at Millarville Community School. This year we have identified three key areas that we hope to address throughout the school year, and over the next three months we will speak to one of those goals, followed by a discussion around that goal at the following School Council meeting.

Our first goal is around Engagement with our community. Traditionally, Millarville Community School has been a major part of the greater community, with parents, local experts, and local organizations spending a large amount of time in the school, with our students, building on the sense of belonging and connectedness. With the pandemic, we have been unable to have that same connection to our families and community, leaving parents and students with a feeling of loss.

Engagement Goal

Create, reintroduce and improve opportunities for the school community to access the school and to provide timely feedback to inform school decisions

Our work around engagement is focused on reconnecting as we slowly discover what will be the new normal. Moving forward, we don't know when or if we will return to pre-pandemic conditions in schools, so it is important we keep the context in mind as we look at how we are progressing. We invite and value ideas from all of our community, as one of the great lessons of the pandemic is how difficulties will drive innovations.
