

Message from the Principal

Welcome to November!

Welcome to November, the time of year when you get to experience all of the seasons each week (and sometimes in a single day)!

I would like to start off by once again thanking everyone for your commitment to keeping your family healthy and our school community healthy as we navigate the realities of school during COVID-19. We're not able to do all of the same things we used to do, but we are learning new ways to learn together, enjoy school together, and celebrate together. Thank you for being allies and helping our students be prepared to protect themselves and their classmates. Everyday we get to be together at school is a great day!

As I mentioned above, we are in the time of year that we can have all types of weather so please make sure your children are "dressed for success". We want students to go out for recess whenever possible so it is important to make sure everyone is dressed for the weather. It is also important to make sure those jackets, mitts, and hats are all labeled so we can help them find their way home when they get lost.

When it does get too cold to go outside for recess, we will have indoor recess. Unfortunately, with COVID guidelines students will have to stay in their classrooms during these situations. There is not an exact temperature that we cancel outdoor recess, but we use -20 Celsius as a guideline. On those days I do go outside frequently throughout the day to check the conditions first hand. In cases of extreme inclement weather, the best way to get up to date information about potential bus or class cancellation is on the division's website (www.fsd38.ab.ca) or local media stations and their websites.

Finally, our first reporting period is coming to a close and our first Learner Profiles will be emailed home on November 26th. We will also be having our first round of parent teacher conferences on November 25th from 3:30 - 7:00. This year we will be conducting the interviews virtually over video conferencing (Google Meets). You will be receiving information about how to book an appointment coming out the week starting November 23rd.

Again, I would like to once again thank you for all you are doing as our partners in education to make this school year a success. It is definitely different, but we are excited to have students at Big Rock everyday, and excited to develop new ways to learn together, be successful together, and celebrate together. Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?


- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- · Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- · Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- · Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.
