Message from Administration

The ringing in of the New Year always gives us an opportunity to reflect on the previous years successes and also to look ahead as the future takes shape.

In looking back at 2017 the staff and students of Spitzee Elementary will take time to celebrate the growth we have made. During the first half of the year our staff professional development has been focused on providing effective feedback to students in order to help them move forward in their learning. In addition, staff have been assisting students in developing the skills and knowledge necessary to both assess and critique their own work and provide effective feedback to their peers.

Social Emotional Learning has also been an area of focus for the staff here at Spitzee as it goes hand in hand with providing effective feedback. In short, brains that are tired, stressed, distracted or distraught cannot access the level of functioning required to think critically and creatively. Our staff have been using the Mind Up curriculum (grades 4 and 5) the Social Thinking curriculum (grades 2 and 3) and Zones of Regulation and Kelso's Choices (grades K and 1) By focusing on mental and emotional health, we hope to help students get to a place where they are confident, resilient, enthusiastic learners, ready to take on all challenges.

In addition to our academic and social emotional focus, we have a number of other exciting activities in the upcoming month here at Spitzee. Grade 5 basketball is in full swing, with remaining games on February 6th in Black Diamond and the final tournament on February 15 at the Aldersyde Fieldhouse. Come on out and cheer on our Stars! Within the school, Ms. Saliken is currently running a Danceplay club that a number of our students are participating in. Grades 1 to 3 take part on Mondays at lunch recess and grade 4 and 5 go Wednesdays at lunch recess. Other amazing things happening in and around the school over the next little while include Lego Club, Drama Club, School Spirit Club, Drumming and a number of literacy week activities too at the beginning of February. On February 9th we will be having our annual Heart to Heart market in support of our UNESCO initiatives.
