> **Literacy**: Read a book and have your child write about the setting of the story.

Numeracy: Grab a handful of small objects (buttons, cotton swabs, paper clips, etc.) along with your child and spill them onto a work area. You both look at your objects, announce how many you think you have, and whether you think you have more than, fewer than, or the same number as the other. Group your items (by 2s, 5s, or 10s), count to determine how many there are, then talk and decide who has more.
