### Unit of Inquiry

Last week the students read various fairytales, and created their own versions of Jack and the Beanstalk. Our classroom was full of laughter as the students acted out "The Three Bears" and "The Three Billy Goats Gruff", as part of our classroom readers theater.

This week the students will be continuing with their readers theater, reading "Little Red Riding Hood", and continuing their discussion of how stories can evoke emotions.

#### Spelling
