We are finishing the current Unit of Inquiry, How the World Works. In our
literacy time, we will continue reading Dr. Seuss stories, writing about the
stories, and doing activities connected to these stories.

In Math, we will be working on word problems with addition and
subtraction to 20. We will be doing review for the last week of school and
playing some math games to reinforce addition and subtraction to 20 and
beyond.
