


# Grade One Classroom Newsletter June 7 - 11, 2021

We had a great week, doing more plant experiments, reading Dr. Seuss books, playing outside, and we had lunch outside on Wednesday. During Library time, the children drew a quilt square for their own small quilt. This activity was initiated by one of our children in the fall, who asked if they could make their own quilts. Mrs. Smallwood is a master of sewing, so we asked for her help. Before the end of the school year, the children will be bringing home their own little guilt for their stuffies. The guilting squares are looking amazing so far! A huge thank you to Mrs. Smallwood for all of her talent and time with this project

We will be doing some reading assessments for one more week during our usually reading time. As a result, the children may not be bringing home new "home reading" books again this week. In Math, we will be doing some assessment of doubles addition and subtraction from 20. Also, we will continue comparing groups of objects, arranging the number of objects from least and greatest, and greatest to least. We will also continue addition and subtraction to 20.

> Numeracy Ideas - Rolling Math Facts: First player rolls 2 dice and adds them together to find the sum. The second player takes a turn The player with the higher sum wins a point. Play until one player reaches 10 points.
