Message from Administration



March Madness: To many people "March Madness" refers to basket-ball playoffs but around Spitzee it seems that the craze refers to all things traffic. It starts away from the school where we have had at least 3 reports of people driving through the "STOP" flashers deployed on the school busses. On one occasion, the alert student and their grandmother stayed back, wary of the oncoming vehicle which did indeed drive on through the flashing lights.

Another area of concern is the Stop, Drop & Roll where frustrations have been growing and we are hearing about it in the office. The system works great when parents only drop off or pick up their children, however getting out of the vehicle to "quickly do something", causes issues throughout the SD&R. If you know you have to get out to pick up a project or meet quickly with the teacher, please pull out of the line and park your vehicle. Thank you.

Finally, we want to remind families that the front of the school is ONLY for school buses from 8 a.m. until 8:45 a.m. and from 2:45 p.m. until 3:45 p.m. Some vehicles have applied to transportation and our school for special permission to drop off students with medical or other special needs. Other day cares or visiting groups may also be using the bus drop off zone which extends the entire length of the front of Spitzee School. Due to this fact we ask that you either wait until the bus drop off is not in effect or park elsewhere on McLeod Trail. Jay walking is not only against traffic laws but is also dangerous when you are crossing between buses, who may not be able to see you due to the length of the bus. Also U Turns in the bus zone could result in fines handed out by local law enforcement.

No matter what area of the roads you are using, the rules and laws are there to protect everyone. We don't want anyone to be physically hurt and we don't want anyone to be witness to an accident. Be Safe!


