# Message from Administration

As we look back at the first couple of months we are deeply thankful for the support our students, staff, parents and families provide to our school community. The 2018/19 school year is moving full steam ahead and it is because of the effort and dedication of all involved.

The safety of our students getting to and from school is of the utmost importance to all of us here at Spitzee. As the leaves fall and the air turns cool we understand that getting your kids to school can be more challenging. If students are walking to school please make sure that they are mindful of the extra time it might take to get into their winter clothes. If you are dropping your child off in the pick up/drop off loop please understand that this process can take a bit longer during the winter months. As always we ask that parents to not exit their vehicles while stopped in the loop. Please be advised that our grade 5's are out on patrols every day before and after school. We know this is very helpful, especially for our younger students, and appreciate parent support of this by being a role model and using the crosswalk when the patrol is on duty.

As we focus this year on increasing student understanding of their own learning we will continue to refine our assessment practice at the classroom level. Please ask your children about specific things they have learned at school and what feedback they received to help them improve their work. It is often helpful to ask about one specific subject area so that kids can be specific in recalling their learning.

We will have our Remembrance Day Ceremony on November 9<sup>th</sup> starting at 10:45, all members of our school community are welcome to attend. Learner Profiles will be coming home with your children on November 19. Please look these over prior to Parent Teacher Interviews which take place on the evenings of November 21 and 22.

# Important Changes to Castle's SnowKids Program

While you may have heard about changes to Castle Mountain Resort's SnowKids program, back in the spring, we wanted to make sure that all parents, within our past participating schools, were aware of what's going on with the program.

In short, the SnowKids program has been absorbed into our regular children's season pass program which removes geographical restrictions, all while keeping the program open to all children ages 6-12. This enables more children to take advantage of the program, regardless of where they live.

The new sign up process is significantly more efficient for parents, since there is no longer a need for a special school code. Parents can simply visit <a href="http://www.skicastle.ca/passes/">http://www.skicastle.ca/passes/</a> to purchase passes for any member of their family or, if desired, call one of our guest services representatives at 888-SKI-TONS or 403-627-5101 for assistance.

Children's / SnowKids passes are also now eligible to be included as part of a family pass. An example of how buying a family pass can be hugely beneficial is that a family pass with one adult and 2 children / SnowKids is actually less expensive than buying a single adult pass.

The team at Castle Mountain Resort is always looking for new and creative ways to keep children and their families engaged in skiing / snowboarding and we're excited about the positive feedback we've received on this change so far.

Our deadline for a \$49 Child / SnowKid pass is extended to November 15th, 2018.
